## QUARTERLY REPORT (JANUARY– MARCH) 2026

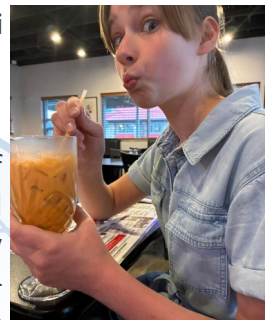
**“We will not hide them from their children, shewing to the generation to come the praises of the LORD, and his strength, and his wonderful works that he hath done.” — Psalm 78:4**

Truly, we must not hide these things from our children, but faithfully show them the works of the Lord and allow them to witness the testimonies of His faithfulness. As they see and hear what God has done, their own hearts are stirred to trust, serve, and follow Him.





## Quarterly Report from Samuel Martin

We thank the Lord for the opportunity to be in several good meetings and a couple of new churches during the month of February. It was a blessing to meet new congregations with a desire to support the Scripture ministry. We praise the Lord for churches that care about getting God's Word to lost souls around the world. We praise the Lord for a couple of new supporting churches!

From January 19–30, I had the privilege of traveling to Thailand on a missions trip. It was a joy to visit with several pastors and churches who have received John and Romans, as well as a limited number of New Testaments. Many of these churches are requesting additional Scriptures—especially New Testaments—to give to new believers who are eager to grow in their understanding of the Lord who now lives in their hearts.

The response to the need for 40,000 New Testaments has been tremendous. While still in Thailand, I messaged my wife about the pastors' requests and their burden for more Scriptures. By the time I landed back in the United States, I had received a message from a supporting church of ours, expressing their desire to help meet this need and make a difference in the spiritual growth of new converts in Thailand. We praise the Lord for their vision and willingness to give above and beyond!

I have also spoken with Brother Bobby Lemmon at Bible and Literature Missionary Foundation regarding printing both John and Romans and New Testaments for us. He has graciously offered to assist as they are able, even while managing the many requests they receive. We are grateful for their partnership and willingness to help in time of need.

In addition, Brian from our church and I have been training on the press and have successfully printed limited quantities of Scripture. There is much to learn to ensure good quality and avoid wasted materials, but we are making progress. As Brother Tim has been able to come in and guide us, we are learning the entire process—from preparing the digital file to making plates and applying ink properly to produce clear, accurate copies of God's Word. Your continued prayers for this learning process are greatly appreciated.

Please also pray for Brother Tim's health. He continues therapy as he battles cancer and works to regain strength and control in his leg and arm following his stroke. Though he understands there will be limitations, he is determined to recover as much use of his left side as possible. His spirit and dedication are a blessing to us.

In addition to the travel to Thailand and various church meetings, the Lord has allowed us to receive help in distributing Scripture to Seedline churches. Tamil John and Romans are currently being assembled, and Brother David Jerald in India continues to send encouraging reports and pictures of souls being saved. He has also shared that the government of India has begun relaxing certain restrictions on meetings. He even mentioned the possibility of once again being permitted to teach the Bible in public schools. We rejoice to see God working in the hearts of government leaders as they witness the positive impact of Jesus Christ in the lives of the people.

I recently received the following message from Brother Jerald:

*"We are taking maximum opportunities for the distribution of John and Romans. Many people testified they got saved by calling on the Name of Jesus Christ and accepting Him as Saviour.*

We have also distributed Thai Scriptures to Seedline churches for assembly. Some portions had already been printed, and Brian and I were able to print the remaining sections—valuable hands-on training for us. In the coming days, we will receive additional Thai Scriptures printed by BLMF.

## Quarterly Report from Dennis Deneau

I'm not sure this winter in Michigan has broken any snow records or it's just the fact that we usually spend our winters going to churches in the South, but this winter has been crazy in Michigan, even with tornadoes. We got our first big snow right after Thanksgiving and "haven't seen grass" until March.

I had 4 strokes in mid-December and several falls after returning home on January 10th. It has been a trial for sure, but God has been with us every step of the way. I've had almost 8 weeks of in-home therapy and will continue with a few more weeks of physical therapy in the community to hopefully get my body back functioning and allowing me to drive again.

I've recently been able to make a few phone calls to some preachers, and many have prayed faithfully for us (if I haven't gotten to you yet, I probably will). Our need for paper money is greater than ever before. Our world population is growing at about 224,000 souls per day. The world (and wars) have grown more wicked each day. You will go home with a blessing in your heart and a desire to do more for the glory of God in the future! You will make new friends, meet some great missionaries, and most likely connect with some old friends.

We are so thankful for a church family that loves the Lord and are quick to step up to fill needs. Without Bro. Tim (Pastor Gibson and his many serious health issues) in the print shop as often as he was, we noticed a slacking in the Scripture printing and assembly. The need for workers was presented to the church and folks have "stepped up" to volunteer in helping with many print shop duties. Praise God for folks like this.

And, we praise God for the church we attend while here in Michigan (Pastor Crowell, Beth Haven Baptist Church) and the precious folks in it. They recently sent a check for \$2,000 for paper to print and ship Scriptures around the world.

Please keep praying for my complete restored health. The world sees our trials. We need to look up and see His blessings.

## Guam Shipment Update

We continue to make steady progress toward completing the John and Romans project for Guam.

- **168,000 copies** completed in English
  - Currently printing:

- **20,000 copies in Chuukese**

Our team is diligently working on several significant web press jobs:

- **Thai John and Romans** – 400,000 copies

- **Hausa New Testaments (Nigeria)** – 40,000 copies
- **Personalized English John and Romans (Missouri & Texas churches)** – 4,000 copies
- **Spanish New Testaments** – Helping meet the growing demand for Spanish materials
