QUARTERLY REPORT (APRIL-JUNE) 2026

On Sunday morning, May 3rd, we enjoyed a fantastic service at Maranatha Baptist Church in Newburgh, Indiana. Bro. Curtis Hall led the adult Sunday School class, and I had the opportunity to provide a ministry update during the morning service, followed by a great message from Pastor Joey Pearson. That evening, I was privileged to present our ministry at Faithway Baptist Church in Evansville, Indiana. It was a joy to connect with Pastor Stephen Russ and his congregation, witnessing the great things the Lord is accomplishing through their ministry.



I am immensely grateful for all that took place during the BEST Missions Bible Conference from May 4-6, organized by Bro. Curtis Hall. He did an exceptional job highlighting the urgent need for Scripture across Asia. Maranatha Baptist Church once again demonstrated their incredible hospitality in hosting the conference. We genuinely appreciated everyone who attended, and I was honored to preach at one of the services as well as receiving great blessings from hearing Bro. John Wilkerson, our main speaker.



On May 6th, Bro. Curtis Hall, my wife, and I hit the road early to reach our next meeting in Marshall, MO. We were thankful to be with Pastor Haggett and Calvary Baptist Church, where we personally expressed gratitude for their generous contribution to printing 40,000 Thai New Testaments. Bro. Curtis Hall was able to share his ministry and preach during their service, and we deeply appreciate their steadfast support.



Later that evening, we returned home to prepare for the shipment of a container to Thailand the next morning. Despite the day's uncertainties regarding the container's departure, we were pleased to confirm that it would arrive at 11:00 AM, although it later pushed to 3:00 PM. We extend our heartfelt thanks to the dedicated group of men from various churches who assisted in loading 1,288 boxes into the container. A special shoutout goes to the truck driver who generously lent a helping hand. This endeavor has truly been a blessing, totaling 253,050 Thai John and Romans bound for those eager to hear the Gospel.



We also want to recognize Calvary Baptist Church in Marshall, MO, for bringing 26 members to support our New Testament collation project, assembling a remarkable 3,200 books. While their experience with 2 or 3-part booklets doesn't compare to our 13-part New Testaments, they met the challenge with enthusiasm and grace. The day was filled with hard work, fellowship, and a shared meal of pizza. We are equally grateful to the faithful volunteers from our home church, Sweet Springs Baptist Church, who sacrificed their Saturday to join us in this mission. You are all a tremendous blessing!

Quarterly Report from Samuel Martin

As I travel many miles delivering Scripture and attending meetings, I am grateful for the safety provided by the Lord. With the recent increase in gas and diesel prices, I strive to maximize each trip. Almost every time I fuel up, the pump stops when it hits \$200—ouch! Yet, I praise the Lord for all our faithful supporters. God knows about these challenges; it's no surprise to Him, and His Word remains the most valuable thing on earth. Millions still desire copies of His Word to enjoy Salvation!

Many hands make light work of large tasks, and we are thankful for all the Seedline churches involved in our various projects. Recently, we made slight adjustments in our collating work to accommodate the printed signatures from the Bible and Literature Missionary Foundation. Their press uses a different size of paper and folding for the signatures, requiring us to change the cover location, stapling, and cutting.

Recently, **40,000 Thai New Testaments** and **40,000 Hausa New Testaments** were successfully printed for us by the Bible and Literature Missionary Foundation (BLMF). Each of these New Testaments consists of 13 parts, making careful collating essential to the process.

We've already boxed up 2,500 copies and are immensely grateful for the churches that are assisting us in this effort. Thank you for your continued support in spreading the Gospel!

Additionally, we're working on Thai Gospel of John and Romans, as well as Tamil for India, Spanish, English, Chuukese, and Yap for Guam. We aim to complete the Tamil and Thai for shipment by the end of August, with the others set to ship in October.

Your prayers for Pastor Gibson are appreciated. He has made some progress with his health and is now able to come into the print shop to help, though he is still limited in mobility. His strength is improving, allowing him to be available longer during the day. Please continue to pray for him; I know he deeply appreciates it.

I also need to address the leaky roof on the cargo trailer I use to haul Scripture, as paper and water do not mix well. I am looking for a trailer repair shop that can fix the roof, so I ask for your prayers regarding this repair and the funds needed to cover it. This 2004 trailer has successfully transported over 22 million pieces of Scripture to and from Seedline churches and delivered completed materials to their final destinations, so we have certainly gotten our money's worth out of it. The trailer measures 8.5 feet wide and 34 feet long, with a one-piece metal roof with a couple of rooftop vents.

We have included several pictures from the mission field. It is always encouraging to hear and see what the Lord is accomplishing with His Word. Oh, how we wish for the United States to reclaim this vision! As our great nation approaches its 250th anniversary, we see a departure from God and the consequences of His blessing being lifted. Please pray for our country, its leadership, and remember to get involved in witnessing to others. God still reigns as King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

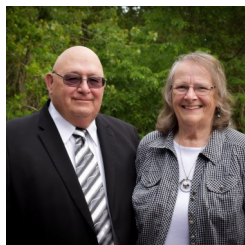

Be sure to mark your calendar and plan to attend. We look forward to what the Lord will do during this special event!

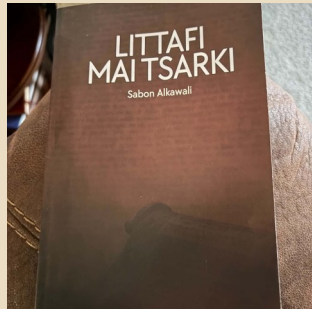
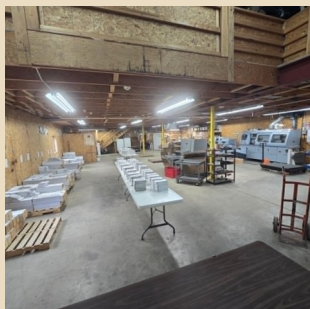


Thank You to Hope Baptist Church!

Exciting Upcoming Projects

As we look ahead to June, we are filled with anticipation for the projects before us—all made possible by the grace of God. Here is a glimpse of what is currently underway:

Guam Shipment Update

We continue to make steady progress toward completing the John and Romans project for Guam.

- **168,000 copies** completed in English
- Currently printing:
- **20,000 copies** in Yap
- **50,000 copies** in Chuukese

These additional printings will finalize this project. We sincerely appreciate your continued prayers and support as we work toward completing this shipment.

Web Press Projects

Our team is diligently working on several significant web press jobs:

- **Thai John and Romans** – 400,000 copies
- **Thai New Testaments** – 40,000 copies
- **Yoruba John and Romans (Nigeria)** – 200,000 copies
- **Hausa New Testaments (Nigeria)** – 40,000 copies
- **Personalized English John and Romans (Missouri & Texas churches)** – 4,000 copies
- **Spanish New Testaments** – Helping meet the growing demand for Spanish materials

Because of the increasing demand for the Word of God, this list of projects changes very quickly.

International Distribution

We are also preparing materials for distribution in Zambia, including:

- **Chichewa Scriptures**
- **Tonga Scriptures**

We are grateful for the opportunity to see God's Word printed and distributed around the world. Thank you for your faithful prayers and support as we continue this vital work.
